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Dear Parent/Carer,

We previously wrote to you explaining what the students had been learning in each curriculum area. Here are the details for each subject for next half term, more details are available on our school website under the 'Curriculum and Learning' tab. You will also find links to your child's learning manager page where we are building up a bank of additional resources and information relevant to your child's stage of learning.

The table below outlines what is being studied during Half Term 6 in Year 8 in each subject and how students are assessed and given feedback to support their progress.

Science	Reactions 2 - Students will begin to identify what the reactants and products are in a chemical reaction, and how heat affects the reaction. The students will then understand the difference between an endothermic and exothermic reaction and how catalysts affect a reaction. Organisms 2 - Students will embed their knowledge of the respiratory system and learn how pressure changes are involved in the mechanisms of breathing. They will relate their knowledge of diffusion to the structure and function of the lungs and the importance of oxygen absorption. Students will then go on to relate the importance of a balanced diet and why enzymes are needed in the digestive system for the effective absorption of food molecules.	End of topic tests

In the coming weeks, you can support your child in a number of ways:

- ★ Check that your child is keeping up with their homework, this will be set through the Google Classroom and will include a clear deadline.
- ★ Use the Google Classroom to check that your child has what they need in their book, you can sit together and go through the lessons to see that they finished the work
- ★ Speak to your child about what they are doing this could be through asking them what they have done and what knowledge they can remember from the lesson.
- ★ Encourage your child to read for pleasure and ensure they always have their book with them in school for our 5 minutes reading time at the start of every lesson.
- ★ Ensure that they have regular breaks from homework and get a good night's sleep work in chunks of time, turn off mobile phones and devices at least one hour in advance of going to bed
- ★ Encourage hobbies and interests which are not technology based
- ★ Let children be bored; this is when creativity occurs and reveals their talents
