

#### Combined Science Vs triple Science - Misunderstandings

- Both triple and combined science cover **all three** sciences AND allow you to progress to **any** science A level.
- Combined science is **NOT** a lower level qualification. It gives access to the full GCSE grade range
- Combined science gives **two GCSEs** and triple gives **three GCSEs**. Remember though, more doesn't mean better.
  - The **quality of teaching** and range of learning experiences in combined science is just as high as in triple science
- It's **not true** that combined science is targeted towards less able children. Many high ability students take combined science.
- If you opt to do triple science instead of combined science, this takes up one out of your four option choices.





## The option curriculum

What should you base your decisions on?

- 1. Your choices should be broad and balanced
- 2. Choose a range of subjects, learning opportunities and assessment styles
- 3. Think about your possible pathway after year 11
- 4. Consider doing what you enjoy and what you
- Own your options. The commitment to do your best over two years of study must come from you.... Remember, these are:
  - Your decisions
  - Your exams
  - Your qualifications
  - Your results

## Vocational and Technical qualifications



- Same degree of rigour and challenge as GCSEs
- Form a key part of our curriculum for years 10 to 13
- Huge growth in uptake from 30 students to now over 300
- Ongoing 'modular' assessment structure rather than final examinations
- Range of assessment methods including practicals, coursework and projects
- Recognised by universities, apprenticeship providers, employers
- Well established grade equivalents to GCSEs
- Current offer for year 10 includes Enterprise & Business; Health and Social Care; Information Technology; Creative Media Production; Dance



## The EBacc. It's your choice

The 'EBacc' is NOT a qualification in it's own right. It reflects a child's choices in a specific group of subjects



#### EBacc is a group of GCSE subjects.

- English language
- English literature
- Maths
- The Sciences
  Combined Science OR 3 separate sciences from Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Computer Science
- Geography **OR** History
- A foreign language

#### 'The EBacc' is <u>not</u> a qualification

Universities, employers, apprenticeship providers and FE colleges <u>DO NOT</u> recognise the EBacc as a qualification neither do any of these bodies ask for The EBacc as part of their entry requirements

Students may opt to study the full EBacc suite of subjects *if they wish to* but it is NOT compulsory. This supports the principle of our option process being 'pro choice with conditions'.

- The English Baccalaureate is a measure of success in core academic subjects; specifically English, Mathematics, History or Geography, the Sciences and a Language. If you would like to gain the English Baccalaureate (Ebacc) you must choose History OR Geography and a Modern Foreign Language (French; German or Spanish) as 2 of your 4 choices

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
