MY Curriculum and the teaching of a personal development curriculum are compulsory lessons for all students at HCCS.


However, parents have the legal right to withdraw their children from specific religious or sex education classes. This should be done in writing to the Upper/ Lower Hubs.

	Curriculum Intent (overview & vision)
1: Future Pathways	Enable students to make informed and responsible choices for their potential future pathways including employment and education.
2: Values	To nurture students' curiosity and develop their understanding of a range of religious, philosophical and ethical traditions and values, creating a stronger sense of empathy and acceptance of difference. We want students to use these experiences to enrich their own understanding of spirituality, as a way of helping them find deeper meaning in their lives.
3: Global Community	To develop students understanding of the scale and diverse cultures of the world we live in, from working within our Holmes Chapel School community to becoming a global citizen.
4:Relationship Sex Education	To ensure our students make positive and informed choices in their relationships and keep our students safe, physically, emotionally and legally.
5. Well Being	To promote the positive mental, emotional and physical wellbeing of our students; allowing students to explore and develop their best selves and through this developing their wellbeing To support students with engagement in, implementation of and taking responsibility for their wellbeing
6: Life Skills	The life skills component of MY Curriculum will build skills around relationships and working in a team that pupils will have experienced across the subject curriculum. 
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
