Dear Parent/Carer

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has reported an increase in measles across the country with a recent outbreak in the West Midlands region of England. Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools, and can be a very unpleasant illness.

If your child **has missed** their MMR vaccinations usually given at age 12 -13 months (1st dose) and 3 years 4 months (Pre-school booster) it is important to take up the vaccine now. If you are unsure if your child's immunisations are up to date, please check their vaccination records (Red Book) or contact your GP to find out if your child has missed any MMR vaccinations.

If required, The School Aged Immunisations Team can provide MMR vaccinations for years 7 – year 11.


